
Delivered: God's Gifts of Grace



Delivered: God's Gifts of Grace offers two levels. Level A is for children who are nonreaders and young readers—generally preschool through those who have finished grade 1. Level B is designed for students who are independent readers; in most cases, this means students who have finished grades 2–6.

The crowds were bringing children to Jesus that He might touch them.


The disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, He was angry. He said to the disciples, "Let the children come to Me. Do not hinder them. For to such belongs















